**Flash estimate of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) and
of the Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP)
January 2016**

**The annual change of the flash estimate of the CPI stands at -0.3%
in December, three tenths lower than that registered in December**

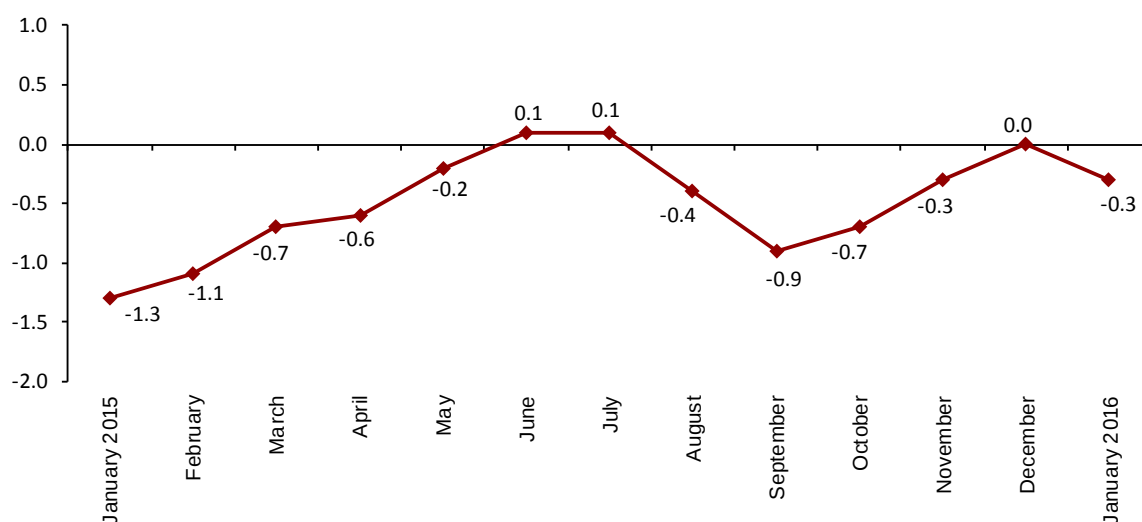
The annual change of the HICP flash estimate is -0.4%

According to the flash estimate published by the INE, the annual inflation of the CPI in January 2016 is -0.3%.

This indicator provides a preview of the CPI that, if confirmed, would imply a decrease of three tenths in its annual rate, given that in December this change was 0.0%.

This decrease is mainly explained by the decrease in the prices of *electricity*.

Overall Index**



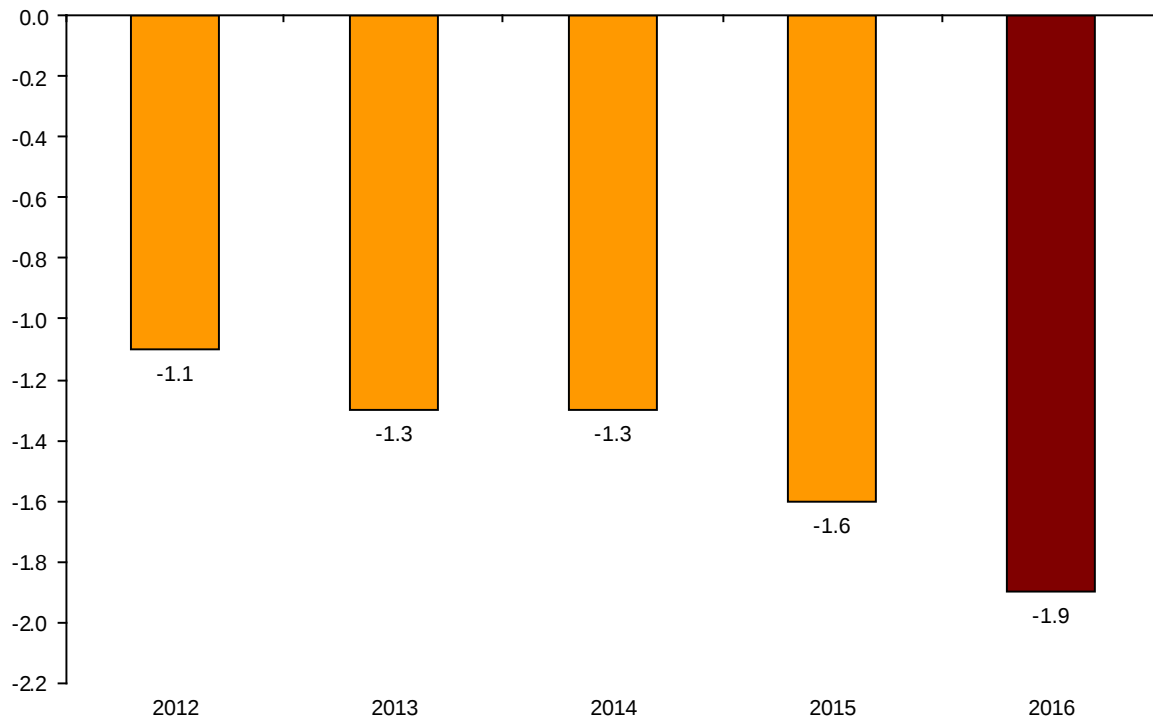

In turn, the annual change of the HICP flash estimate in January stands at -0.4%. If confirmed, the annual change of the HICP would have decreased three tenths as compared to the previous month.

Evolution of the monthly change

According to the flash estimate of the CPI, consumer prices registers a -1.9% variation in January, as compared to the month of December.

Evolution of the monthly rate of the CPI in the month of January



In turn, the monthly change of the HICP flash estimate in January stands at -2.5%.
