Flash estimate of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) and of the Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP) June 2015

The annual change of the flash estimate of the CPI stands at 0.1% in June, three tenths higher than that registered in May


The annual change of the HICP flash estimate is 0.0%

According to the flash estimate published by the INE, the annual inflation of the CPI in June 2015 is 0.1%.

This indicator provides a preview of the CPI that, if confirmed, would imply an increase of three tenths in its annual rate, given that in May this change was -0.2%.

This increase is mainly explained by the increase in the prices of *electricity* and *food and non-alcoholic beverages*.

Annual evolution of the CPI, base 2011 (1) Overall Index





In turn, the annual change of the HICP flash estimate in June stands at 0.0%. If confirmed, the annual change of the HICP would have increased three tenths as compared to the previous month.

Evolution of the monthly change

According to the flash estimate of the CPI, consumer prices registers a 0.3% variation in June, as compared to the month of May.

Evolution of the monthly rate of the CPI in the month of June



In turn, the monthly change of the HICP flash estimate in June stands at 0.2%.
