Flash estimate of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) and of the Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP) September 2015


The annual change of the flash estimate of the CPI stands at -0.9% in September, five tenths lower than that registered in August

The annual change of the HICP flash estimate is -1.2%

According to the flash estimate published by the INE, the annual inflation of the CPI in September 2015 is -0.9%.

This indicator provides a preview of the CPI that, if confirmed, would imply a decrease of five tenths in its annual rate, given that in August this change was –0.4%.

This decrease is mainly explained by the decrease in the prices of *electricity* and *fuels* (gas and diesel oil).




In turn, the annual change of the HICP flash estimate in September stands at -1.2%. If confirmed, the annual change of the HICP would have decreased seven tenths as compared to the previous month.



Evolution of the monthly change

According to the flash estimate of the CPI, consumer prices registers a -0.3% variation in September, as compared to the month of August.

Evolution of the monthly rate of the CPI in the month of September



In turn, the monthly change of the HICP flash estimate in September stands at -0.4%1.

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¹ Due to methodological differences between CPI and HICP in the treatment of the group *clothing and footwear*, in the change of season a discrepancy may occur in the monthly trend of both indices.
