Flash estimate of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) and of the Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP) November 2014

The annual change of the flash estimate of the CPI stands at -0.4% in November, three tenths lower than that registered in October


The annual change of the HICP flash estimate is -0.5%

According to the flash estimate published by the INE, the annual inflation of the CPI in November 2014 was -0.4%.

This indicator provides a preview of the CPI that, if confirmed, would imply a decrease of three tenths in its annual rate, given that in October this change was –0.1%.

This decrease was mainly explained by the decrease in the prices of energy prices (*electricity* and *fuels*).

Annual evolution of the CPI. Base 2011 (1) General Index




(1) The latest data refers to the flash estimate

In turn, the annual change of the HICP flash estimate in November stood at -0.5%. If confirmed, the annual change of the HICP would have decreased three tenths as compared to the previous month.

Evolution of the monthly change

According to the flash estimate of the CPI, consumer prices registered a -0.1% variation in November, as compared with the month of October.

Evolution of the monthly rate of the CPI in the month of November



In turn, the monthly change of the HICP flash estimate in November stood at -0.2%.
