#### Housing Price Index (HPI). Base 2007 Second quarter 2015

# The annual rate of the HPI stands at 4.0% in the second quarter of 2015

# The price of housing increases 4.2% as compared with the previous quarter

#### Annual evolution of housing prices

The annual rate of the Housing Price Index (HPI) in the second quarter of 2015 increased two points and a half, standing at **4.0%**.

By type of housing, the annual variation of **new housing** stood at **4.9%**, nearly one point over that registered in the previous quarter.

In turn, the annual rate for second-hand housing increased 2.7 points, reaching 3.8%.


## Annual evolution of the HPI General index, new housing and second-hand housing



#### **Quarterly Housing Price Evolution**

The general HPI variation in the second quarter 2015 was 4.2%.

#### Evolution of the quarterly rate of h HPI in the last two years



By type of housing, new housing prices increased by **1.5%** between the first and the second quarter 2015. In turn, second-hand housing prices increased by **4.6%** in the quarterly rate.

#### Results by Autonomous Community. Annual variation rates


The annual rate increased in all Autonomous Communities in the second quarter 2015, except in Castilla La Mancha, where the annual rate stood at 1.8%.

The greatest increases in this variation were registered in Cantabria (5.1%) and Illes Balears (7.3%), with increases of 5.4 and 4.5 points, respectively.

In turn, the lowest increases in this variation were registered in Extremadura (one tenth higher, reaching 0.9%) and Galicia (with three tenths higher, reaching 0.8%).

#### Annual rates of te HPI, base 2007


General index by Autonomous City and Community



#### Results by Autonomous Community. Quarterly variation rates

The quarterly variation of the HPI was positive in most Autonomous Communities in the second quarter 2015. The greatest increases were registered in Cataluña (5.4%) and Cantabria (5.1%).

In turn, Extremadura (1.0%) and País Vasco (1.7%) were the Communities that registered the lowest quarterly rates.
