### Passenger Transport Statistics January 2009. Provisional data

The number of passengers using city transport decreases 5.7% in January, as compared with the same month the previous year

# The number of passengers using inter-city transport decreases 4.1% in the interannual rate

More than 262.3 million passengers used **city transport** in January, representing a 5.7% decrease with regard to the same month of 2008. Decreases of 6.1% in the bus service, and 5.1% in the metropolitan service, were recorded in January.

On the other hand, **inter-city transport** was used by nearly 147.5 million passengers, 4.1% less than during the same month the previous year.



## General scheduled city transport by bus decreases 6.1%

More than 152.2 million passengers used the general scheduled city bus this past month of January, representing a decrease of 6.1% as compared with the same month of 2008.

By Autonomous Community, it is worth noting the interannual decreases registered in Extremadura (-11.3%), and Comunidad de Madrid (-10.5%).

#### Transport by special scheduled city bus decreases 5.4%

During the month of January, the special scheduled city bus service experienced a decrease of 5.4% in the interannual rate. This decrease was observed by the two types of transport that comprise it: for students (-4.6%) and for workers (-8.0%).

#### Transport by metropolitan decreases 5.1% in the interannual rate

The number of passengers using the metropolitan decreased 5.1% in January as compared with the same month in 2008. While Valencia registered an increase of 4.8%, the number of passengers transported decreased in Bilbao, Madrid and Barcelona, by 6.1%, 5.7% and 5.4%, respectively.

#### Inter-city transport decreases 4.1% as compared with January 2008

The number of passengers using inter-city transport exceeded 147 million during the month of January, representing an interannual decrease of 4.1%.

In road transport, the number of passengers using the bus to commute decreased 2.9% in the interannual rate. Decreases were registered among the users of scheduled transport in both cases: general scheduled (-2.3%) and special scheduled (-3.5%). Unscheduled transport decreased 4.9% as compared with the same month the previous year.

Domestic air transport experienced a drop of 23.2% in the interannual rate, as compared with January 2008. Rail transport registered a rate of -5.2%, due to the decrease in the number of local train users.
