## The number of passengers using public transport increases by 22.8% in July, as compared with the same month of 2021

## The annual rate for city transport increases by 17.9% and for intercity transport by 25.2%


#### **Evolution of passenger transport**

More than 322.5 million passengers used public transport in July, 22.8% more than in the same month of 2021.

The annual rate for city transport increases by 17.9% and for inter-city transport 25.2%. Within the latter, it is worth noting the 53.6% rise in the maritime transport.

Annual rate. Percentage





#### **Evolution of the monthly rate**

The variation rate of the number of public transport passengers in July as compared with June was -15.3%. In order to contribute to the analysis and interpretation of data, the evolution of the monthly rate of public transport passengers in recent years is shown in the following chart.

#### **City transport**


City transport was used by more than 196.5 million passengers in July, 17.9% more than in the same month of 2021.

Metro transport increased by 22.9% in annual rate. Valencia's metro registered the highest increase (42.3%), and Bilbao's the lowest (8.6%).

Among the cities with metro, the highest increase in bus transport was registered in Palma (29.9%), and the lowest in Bilbao (4.2%).

Annual rate. Percentage




City transport by bus increased by 14.5% in July, as compared with the same month of 2021.

All the Autonomous Communities showed positive annual rates. The highest increases were showed in Cataluña (21.3%), Comunitat Valenciana (20.3%) and Principado de Asturias (15.7%).

In turn, Aragón (5.1%), Comunidad de Madrid (8.3%) and Extremadura (8.7%) showed the lowest increases in bus transport.

#### **Inter-city transport**

More than 102.2 million passengers used inter-city transport in July, representing a 25.2% increase as compared with the same month of 2021.


By mode of transport, the maritime transport increased by 53.6%, air transport by 31.2%, the bus transport by 25.4%, and the rail transport by 23.5%.

Commuter transport increased by 22.3% by bus and by rail transport by 21.3%. Regional transport increased by 31.9% by bus and by 39.8% by rail transport.

Finally, long distance transport increased by 50.2% by bus and by 40.3% by rail transport. Within the latter, the high speed railway increased by 45.0%.

#### Special and unscheduled transport

More than 23.7 million passengers used special and unscheduled transport in July, indicating an increase of 65.8% in annual rate.

The number of special transport passengers increased by 3.8%, reaching more than 7.5 million users. Within this, school transport increased by 3.2% and work transport did so by 3.9%.

Finally, unscheduled transport increased by 130.5% as compared with the same month of 2021, with more than 16.1 million passengers.

#### Revisions and data update

On the press release day, INE has updated PT data for the same month of the previous year. Results are available at INEBase.

#### Methodological note

The purpose of the Passenger Transport Statistics (PT) is to provide monthly information regarding the number of passengers transported by city transport (bus and metropolitan), intercity transport (road, rail, air and sea) and special and unscheduled bus transport.

Road transport in researched through a simple survey. For rail transport, the number of passengers is calculated using the information provided by the railway operators (RENFE and other autonomous companies). The information for air transport is provided by Civil Aviation, and for sea transport, the number of passengers disembarked is compiled using information from State Ports.

**Survey Type**: ongoing monthly.

Population scope: companies involved in passenger transport irrespective of their main

activity.

**Geographical scope**: the whole county.

Reference period of the results: month.

Reference period of the information: month.

**Sample size**: Approximately 1,500 companies.

**Type of sampling**: stratified random sampling of companies, by Autonomous Communities, number of employees and type of transport.

**Collection method**: fill in a questionnaire by respondent using one of the following methods: internet (IRIA system), email, fax, telephone or post.
