Retail Trade Indices. Base 2005 March 2007. Provisional data


Retail trade at constant prices grows 5.7% in March, as compared to the same month in 2006.

The general retail trade index in constant terms (in other words, after eliminating the price effect) registered a 5.7% interannual increase in the month of March. Foodstuff increased 4.5%, whilst non-food produce grew 6.4%. A breakdown of the latter by type of product shows annual growth amounting to 7.2% for Personal Goods, 4.4% in Furniture and household equipment and 5.5% in Other goods.

After adjusting the calendar effect (that is, the difference between the number of working days in a month throughout the different years) the retail price index at constant prices registers a 5.5% increase.




Sales in department stores presented a 7.7% increase of the interannual rate in constant terms.

The general index for department stores, which analyses the evolution of sales in premises that spread out over more than 2,500 square metres, showed a 7.7% interannual increase at constant prices in March 2007. Foodstuff increased 4.0%, whilst non-food produce grew 10.0%.

Annual rates for Department Stores (constant prices)

Castilla-La Mancha, Cantabria and Región de Murcia are the autonomous communities where greater interannual increase in sales rates have been registered

By Autonomous Communities, the highest increase in constant terms of the retail trade index in the month of March corresponded to Castilla-La Mancha (9.7%), Cantabria (9.5%), and Región de Murcia (8.9%) and Comunidad de Madrid (8.1%)

The lowest interannual increases are registered in Andalucía (3.5%), Comunitat Valenciana (4.0%) and Castilla y León (4.4%).

Employment in the retail sector increased 1.8% in March 2007, as compared to the same month in the previous year.

The employment index (showing the evolution of employment, both for employees and selfemployed workers) yielded a 1.8% interannual growth for the whole of the retail sector, during March 2007. In department stores overall employment has increased by 0.9%.

Región de Murcia yielded the greatest occupation rate increases with regards to the same month from the previous year

On an Autonomous Community basis, the greatest interannual employment increases have been accounted for in Región de Murcia (6.0%), Castilla y León (2.8%), Galicia (2.3%) and País Vasco (2.3%).

The communities with lower increase rates are Andalucía (0.8%), Principado de Asturias (1.0%) and Illes Balears (1.0%).
