Tourist Movements at Borders (FRONTUR) May 2021. Provisional data

Spain received nearly 1.4 million international tourists in May

Germany is the main country of residence with 338,408 tourists, accounting for 24.8% of the total

The high alert period for the management of the health crisis situation caused by COVID-19 suppressed the flow of international visitors to Spain for tourist reasons in May 2020. For thus, there were not visitor's entry during this month.

For this reason, it is not possible to calculate variation rates of May 2021 with respect the same month last year for this survey.

Inflow of tourists

Spain received in May the visit of 1.4 million international tourists. Germany was the main country of residence, with 338,408 tourists, accounting for 24.8% of the total.

France and Netherlands were the following countries with the most tourists visiting Spain. From France we received 330,656 and from Netherlands 72,315.

In the first five months of 2021 the number of tourists visiting Spain decreased by 69.7% and exceed 3.2 million. 10.6 millions of international tourists came in the same period last year.


The main sending countries so far this year were France (with 749,065 tourists and a decrease of 44.9% as compared to the first five months of 2020), Germany (with 669,647, and a decrease of 48.5%) and Rest of Europe (with 426,422 tourists, 52.6% less).


International tourist arrivals (*) by country of residence

Main destination Autonomous Communities

Illes Balears was the main tourist destination in May, with 27.9% of the total. It was followed by Cataluña (18.4%) and Andalucía (12.2%).


380,882 tourists came to Illes Balears. The main countries of residence of tourists visiting this Autonomous Community were Germany (with 232,279) and France (with 37,626).

The number of tourists visiting Cataluña decreased stood 251,546. Of them, 117,417 came from France and 39,792 came from Rest of Europe.

The third main destination Autonomous Community by number of tourists was Andalucía, with 166,330. France was the main country of origin (with 44,981), followed by Germany (16,849).

In the accumulated first five months of 2021, the Autonomous Communities that received the most tourists were Illes Balears (with 599,531 tourists and an increase of 48.0% as compared with the same period in 2020), Cataluña (with 570,844 and a decrease of 74.5%) and Canarias (with 532,252, and 80.5% less).

Forms of access and main means of accommodation

Most tourists visiting Spain in May came by air, with 976,018.

Road entries arrived 372,788 tourists, railway access registered 9,280 and port arrivals arrived 5,539.

In May, market accommodation was the main type of accommodation with more than a million of tourists. Within this type, hotel accommodation was the main type of accommodation with 794,960 tourists. While rented dwellings took the second place with 163,618.

On the other hand, non-market accommodation accounted 354,194 tourists. The number of tourists staying in relatives or friends' homes accounted by 171,280 and that of those staying in their own dwelling were 155,662.

(*):Two principal groups of accommodation are distinguished, depending on whether there has been a monetary transaction: market accommodation (paid accommodation; hotels, rented accommodation, camp sites, country houses and other market accommodation) and non-market accommodation (own home, relatives or friends' homes and other non-market accommodation).

Main reason, length of stay and organization of the trip

In May, *Leisure, recreation, and holidays* were the main reasons for travelling to Spain for more than 1 million tourists.

A total of 180,473 tourists arrived for *Business and professional reasons* and 176,463 arrived for Other reasons.

A stay of four to seven nights was the main length among tourists in May, with 650,530 tourists

The number of visitors among those without overnight stays (excursionists) was more than 1,3 million. Tourists with longer duration (more than 15 nights) were 116,229.

Revision and updating of data

Coinciding with today's publication, INE has updated the data corresponding to the month of May 2020. The results are available at INEBase.

Methodological note

The main objective of the Tourist Movement on Borders Survey (FRONTUR) is to estimate the number of non-residents visiting Spain on a monthly basis, as well as to know the main characteristics of the trips made by these visitors.

For the preparation of FRONTUR the international definitions and recommendations of the UNWTO and EUROSTAT in this field are followed.

Type of operation: continuous monthly statistics.

Population scope: this refers to non-residents in Spain who enter our country, whether or not they have stayed overnight, as well as those who pass through our country in transit.

Geographical scope: the entire national territory. The sample is collected at the main access points for non-resident travellers, both by road, airport, port and rail.

Reference period of the results: the month.

Sample size: the annual theoretical sample size of FRONTUR exceeds 450,000 surveys, which are distributed throughout the year, taking into account the seasonality of passenger flows.

Type of sampling: the sample design, a series of strata have been defined for each form of entry that group together border points, airports, ports or railway lines, respectively. In the road and airport sample allocation, the day of the week in which the survey has been carried out is also identified, differentiating between working days, weekends and holidays. Furthermore, in airports 20 air relations are defined (Spanish airport of origin-country of destination airport) which also determine the sample design in this form of access.

Collection method: information is collected by direct interview when the traveller leaves Spain, using a multilingual electronic questionnaire.
