
### Harmonised Labour Cost Index (HLCI). Base 2016 First quarter 2022. Provisional data

# The quarterly variation of the cost per hour worked is 0.8%, after adjusting for seasonal and calendar effects

# The cost per hour worked increases 1.9% in the annual rate in the series adjusted for calendar and seasonal effects, and 1.2% in the original series

## Quarterly variation of the Index

The quarterly variation in the HLCI–which measures the labour cost per hour worked while maintaining the structure by branch of activity constant–stood at 0.8% between the first quarter of 2022 and the fourth of 2021, after adjusting for seasonal and calendar effects.

By cost component, in seasonally and calendar adjusted data, wage costs showed a variation of 0.7%, and other costs of 0.9%.

Excluding seasonal and calendar adjustment, the quarterly rate is -10.2%, mainly due to the lower weight of extraordinary payments in the first quarter of 2022 compared to the previous quarter.



#### Annual variation of the Index

The cost per hour worked increased by 1.2% in the first quarter of 2022, as compared with the same period of the previous year.

The annual variation of the cost per hour was 1.9%, after adjusting for seasonal and calendar effects.

By cost component, wage costs recorded an annual variation of 2.2% in adjusted data and other costs increased by 0.9%.

#### **Results by activity sections**

The sections that registered the greatest annual increases in the first quarter were *Financial* and insurance activities (9.9%), *Real estate activities* (5.0%) and *Professional*, scientific and technical activities (3.9%).

On the other hand, the greatest decreases occurred in *Extractive industries* (-26.2%), *Artistic*, *recreational and entertainment activities* (-8.3%) and *Information and communications* (-3.2%).


After adjusting for seasonal and calendar effects, the activities that presented the highest annual rates were *Financial and insurance activities* (9.5%), *Education* 4.7% and *Real estate activities* (4.3%).

The greatest decreases were recorded in *Mining and quarrying* (-20.1%), *Artistic, recreational and entertainment activities* (-6.0%) and *Electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply* (-5.1%).

#### Results by activity sections and cost components. Original series

The sections that registered the greatest annual increases in *wage costs* in the first quarter were *Financial and insurance activities* (9.4%), *Real estate activities* (5.4%) and *Professional, scientific and technical activities* (5.2%).

On the other hand, the greatest decreases occurred in *Mining and quarrying* (-31.8%), *Artistic, recreational and entertainment activities* (-8.2%) and *Information and communications* (-2.5%).

With regard to *other costs*, the sections with the highest annual increases were *Financial and insurance activities* (11.8%), *Education* (3.7%) and *Real estate activities* (3.6%).

Those with the lowest rates were Accommodation and food service activities (-14.0%), Artistic, recreational and entertainment activities (8.8%) and Information and communications (-5.3%).

#### Revision and updating of data

Coinciding with today's publication, the HLCI provisional data for the fourth quarter of 2021 has been updated. The final index stands at 115.0 points.

The quarterly variation of the original series for that quarter stood at 3.4%, and that of the adjusted index was 0.9%. On the other hand, the annual rate of the original series was 1.3% and that for the index adjusted for seasonal and calendar effects, 0.9%. The results are available at INEBase.

# Methodological note

The Harmonised Labour Cost Index (HLCI) is a quarterly continuous statistical operation whose objective is to provide a common and comparable measure of labour cost per hour worked for the whole of the European Union, allowing the monitoring of the evolution of said labour costs.

Indices with base 2016 are provided for total labour costs, wages and salaries and other costs net of subsidies received for the use of labour factor (includes social contributions payable by employers and non-wage payments). The index for total labour cost is also provided excluding extraordinary payments and delayed payments.

Type of operation: Statistics presented mainly in the form of indices.

Base year: 2016.

Population scope: Employees in local units.

Sources of information: The Quarterly Labour Cost Survey which is conducted on the basis of the Social Security contribution accounts. General Scheme: Sections B to S of CNAE-09 and Special Scheme for Seafarers: Sea Transport (Division 50 of CNAE-09). In order to cover all employees of the general government, information from the DARETRI file is used.

Geographical scope: the entire national territory.

Reference period of the results: the calendar quarter.

Calculation method: Chained Laspeyres.
