Export (IPRIX) and Import (IPRIM) Price Indices of Industrial Products. Base 2015

November 2022. Provisional data

The annual variation rate of the IPRIX stands at 10.6%, one and a half points lower than that registered in October

The annual variation of the IPRIM is 15.7%, nearly three and a half points lower than that of the previous month

Annual evolution of export prices

The annual rate of the Export Price Index (IPRIX) was 10.6% in November, almost one and a half points below that registered in October.


Among the industrial sectors with a negative effect on the decrease in the annual rate of the General IPRIX, and by the economic destination of the goods, worth noting were:

- Intermediate goods had an annual rate of 12.2%, more than two percentage points lower than in October. This was due to the drop in the prices of the Manufacture of basic chemicals, fertilisers and nitrogen compounds, plastics and synthetic rubber in primary forms and of the Manufacture of basic iron and steel and of ferro-alloys, compared to the increases registered in November 2021.
- **Energy**, whose annual variation fell by almost eight points, to 7.5%. This was the result of a decrease in the prices of *Electric power generation, transmission and distribution* and, to a lesser extent, of the *Manufacture of refined petropeum products*, which increased in the same month last year.

In turn, the only industrial sector with a positive influence was:

• **Durable consumer goods** had a variation of 9.8%. That was more than two points higher than October, and was due to the fact that the prices of the *Manufacture of domestic appliances* rose more this month than they did in November of the previous year.

Contribution of industrial sectors to the annual IPRIX rate




Annual rate difference overall IPRIX

The annual variation of the general index excluding Energy decreased more than one point, to 9.9%, standing seven tenths below that of the general IPRIX.

General index and general index without Energy Percentage




Monthly evolution of export prices

In November, industrial export prices registered a monthly rate of -0.6%, as compared with the month of October.

By economic destination of the goods, among the industrial sectors that have a negative monthly effect on the general index, worth noting are:

- **Energy** had a rate of -7.1%, primarily due to the decrease in the prices of *Electric power generation, transmission and distribution*. This sector's contribution to the overall index was 0.423.
- **Intermediate goods,** which recorded a monthly rate of -0.5% and a variation of -0.195, primarily caused by the decrease in the prices of *Manufacture of basic chemicals*, *fertilisers and nitrogen compounds*, *plastics and synthetic rubber in primary forms*.

Also worth noting, although in the opposite direction, was the rise in the prices of *Manufacture* of rubber products.

On the other hand, worth noting amongst the industrial sectors with a positive monthly effect were:

• **Non-durable consumer goods**, with a monthly rate of 0.3% and a contribution of 0.065. This was primarily due to the increase in the prices of *Manufacture of vegetable and animal oils and fats*.


Annual evolution of industrial prices, combining domestic and foreign markets

The Industrial Price Index of the domestic and foreign markets, which is obtained as the aggregation of the IPRI and the IPRIX, decreased its annual rate by almost three and a half points in November, to 17.5%.

In turn, the annual variation rate of the general index, excluding Energy, fell by one point, to 11.3%, standing more than six points below the general IPRIM+IPRIX rate.

General index and general index without Energy Percentage




Annual evolution of import prices

The Import Price Index (IPRIM) registered an annual rate of 15.7% in November, nearly three and a half points below that of October.

By economic destination, all industrial sectors had a negative influence on the variation of the annual IPRIM rate. Among these, worth noting were:

- **Energy,** whose annual rate decreased more than 10 points, to 39.0%. The decrease in the prices of the *Extraction of crude petroleum and natural gas*, compared to the increase in November of the previous year, and of the *Manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products*, which decreased this month more than in 2021, stood out in this behavior.
- **Intermediate goods** presented an annual variation of 13.1%, which was two and a half points lower than in October. This resulted from a price decrease in the *Chemical Industry*, compared to the increase in November of last year.
- The rate of **Non-durable consumer goods** stood at 8.7%. This was more than two points below that of the previous month and was due to the fact that prices in the **Food industry** fell, while they rose in the same month of the previous year.

Contribution of industrial sectors to the annual IPRIM rate




Annual rate difference General IPRIM

The annual variation rate of the general index excluding Energy decreased by more than one point, up to 10.7%, standing five points below the general IPRIM rate.

General index and general index without Energy Percentage




Monthly evolution of import prices

In November, the monthly variation of the Import Price Index was -1.1%.

By economic destination of the goods, among the industrial sectors that had a negative monthly effect on the general IPRIM, those worth noting were:

- **Energy** had a monthly variation of –2.7%. This was due to the decrease in the prices of the *Manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products* and of the *Extraction of crude petroleum and natural gas*. This sector's contribution to the overall index was -0.600.
- **Intermediate goods** had a rate of -0.9% and a contribution of -0.262. This was primarily caused by the decrease in the prices of the *Chemical industry*.
- **Non-durable consumer goods**, which recorded a variation of -0.9% and a contribution of -0.178, due to a decrease in the prices of *Manufacture of food products*.

A more detailed analysis shows the activities that most affected the monthly rate of the IPRIM in the month of November.

Data Review and Update

Coinciding with today's publication, the INE has updated the data of the IPRIX and IPRIM series corresponding to the last three months, becoming final in the month of August 2022. The results are available at INEBase.

Methodological note

The Export Price Index (IPRIX) is a short-term indicator that measures the monthly evolution of the prices of industrial products manufactured in the domestic market and sold in the foreign market.

On the other hand, the Import Price Index (IPRIM) is a short-term indicator that measures the monthly evolution of the prices of industrial products from the rest of the world.

In order to obtain them, a continuous monthly survey is conducted, which investigates every month industrial establishments that carry out operations in the foreign market.

Type of survey: monthly continuous survey

Base year: 2015.

Reference period of the weightings: the year preceding the current year

Population scope: industrial workplaces

Sample size: 3,800 industrial establishments for the IPRIX and 4,700 for the IPRIM.

Number of observations: In the IPRIX approximately 14,000 monthly prices of 1,700 products and in the IPRIM approximately 18,000 prices of 2,100 products.

General calculation method: Laspeyres' Chain Index.

Collection method: internet (IRIA system), e-mail, fax, telephone or postal mail.
