#### Registered Health Professionals Statistics Year 2018

# The number of registered health care professionals increased by 3.7% compared to the previous year

## The rate of registered doctors stood at 5.55 per 1,000 inhabitants and the rate of nurses was 6.55

The number of registered health care professionals in Spain was 852,481 in 2018, 3.7% more than the previous year. By sex, 271,990 were men (a 2.7% increase) and 580,491 were women (a 4.2% increase).

The majority were *nurses* (36.10%), followed by *doctors* (30.57%) and *pharmacists* (8.69%). In turn, less highly represented groups included *physicists*, *chemists* and *biologists* specialising in health care (0.03%, 0.04% and 0.05% respectively).

The number of registered *doctors* in Spain increased by 6,792 people (2.7%) reaching a total of 260,588 in 2018.

On the other hand, registered *nurses* increased by 7,938 people (2.6%), standing at 307,762. Within this group, 9,236 people were registered as *midwives*<sup>1</sup> (2.5% more than in 2017).

The number of registered professionals in the other health care professions covered by the statistics also increased, except for the number of *chemists* specialising in health care (-7.4%) and *biologists* (-32.7%) The largest increases were registered in *physicists specialising in health care* (25.9%), *physicists* (25.8%) and *occupational therapists* (16.4%).

#### Rates of registered health professionals

The number of registered health professionals per 1,000 inhabitants differs according to the group. In 2018, the number of *nurses* presented the highest rate (6.55 per 1,000 inhabitants), followed by *doctors* (5.55) and *pharmacists* (1.58).


In turn, the lowest rates were observed in the groups of *occupational therapists* (0.09) *and dietitian nutritionists* (0.10).

In the particular case of nurses specializing in *midwifery,* the rate was 0.88 per 1,000 women of childbearing age.

#### Registered health care professionals. 2018


Rate per 1,000 inhabitants



The number of registered professionals per capita increased in all groups, except in the case of *dental technicians*, where the number did not vary. The rates that increased most were those of *psychologists* (0.14 per 1,000 inhabitants), *nurses* (0.12) and *doctors* (0.11).

Rate per 1,000 inhabitants




#### Registered health professionals by sex, age and employment status

The health profession has a predominantly female presence. In 13 out of 16 professions analysed there were more registered women than men. The groups with the highest percentage of women in 2018 were speech therapists (93.6% were women), occupational therapists (91.0%) and dietitian nutritionists (86.4%).

On the other hand, the professions with the lowest percentage of women in 2018 were *dental technicians* (28.8%), *physicists* specialising in health care (33.6%) and *veterinarians* (49.5%).

By age group, the highest percentages of health professionals under 45 years of age were found in *occupational therapists* (92.2%), *dietitian nutritionists* (90.3%) and *physiotherapists* (86.1%).

The lowest percentages in this age group were presented by doctors (36.9%), biologists specialising in health care (42.5%) and dental technicians (43.6%).



According to employment status, the lowest percentages of non-retired registered professionals were in *doctors* (86.0%), *nurses* (89.9%) and *chemists specialising in health care* (93.6%).

On the other hand, the highest percentages of non-retired registered professionals were in dietitian nutritionists (100%), occupational therapists (99.9%) and psychologists (99.6%).

#### **Data by Autonomous Communities and Cities**

In 2018, the number of registered doctors increased in all Autonomous Communities.

The greatest increases were recorded in Canarias (3.7%), Cantabria (3.5%) and La Rioja (3.3%). By contrast, the smallest increases occurred in Aragón (1.7%), and in Castilla y León and the Autonomous City of Ceuta (1.8% in both).

The Communities with the highest rates of registered *doctors* were Comunidad de Madrid (6.77 per 1,000 inhabitants), Aragón (6.76) and Comunidad Foral de Navarra (6.41).

In turn, the Autonomous Cities of Melilla (3.47) and Ceuta (3.92) and Castilla-La Mancha (4.37) showed the lowest rates.

In the case of *nurses*, the number of registered nurses increased compared to the previous year in all Autonomous Communities, except La Rioja (–0,2%).

The greatest increases were registered in the Autonomous City of Ceuta (9.6%), Extremadura (8.7%) and the Autonomous City of Melilla (4.6%). In turn, the smallest increases were registered in Comunidad Foral de Navarra (0.5%), Asturias (0.9%) and Castilla La-Mancha (1.0%).



The Communities with the highest rates of registered *nurses* were Comunidad Foral de Navarra (10.40 per 1,000 inhabitants), Cantabria (8.12) and Comunidad de Madrid (7.94).

For its part, the lowest rates were in the Región de Murcia (with 4.43 registered *nurses* per 1,000 inhabitants), Illes Balears (5.34) and Andalucía and Galicia (5.37 in both).

As for the other professions, the highest ratios of registered *pharmacists* per 1,000 inhabitants were in Comunidad Foral de Navarra (2.29), Comunidad de Madrid (1.95) and Galicia (1.90). In turn, the lowest rates were recorded in the Autonomous Cities of Melilla (1.01) and Ceuta (1.07), and in Illes Baleares (1.14).

The highest rates of *physiotherapists* were found in Comunidad de Madrid (1.59 per 1,000 inhabitants), Principado de Asturias (1.38) and Cataluña (1.35). And the lowest rates were found in the Autonomous Cities of Ceuta and Melilla (0.52 in both) and in Andalucía (0.85).

The highest rates of registered *dentists* were in Comunidad de Madrid (1.26), País Vasco (0.86) and Principado de Asturias (0.85). The lowest rates were in the Autonomous City of Ceuta (0.46) and in Castilla-La Mancha and the Autonomous City of Melilla (0.49 in both).

The highest rates of *psychologists* specialising in health care were 1.64 per 1,000 inhabitants in Comunidad de Madrid, 1.02 in the Autonomous City of Melilla and 0.89 in Canarias, Región de Murcia and Principado de Asturias. For its part, the lowest rates were 0.23 in Castilla-La Mancha, 0.32 in the Autonomous City of Ceuta and 0.37 in Comunitat Valenciana.

Región de Murcia presented the highest rate of registered *optician-optometrists* (0.51) followed by Comunidad de Madrid and Comunitat Valenciana (0.46 in both). The lowest rates were recorded in the Autonomous Cities of Melilla and Ceuta (0.21 and 0.23 respectively), and in Illes Baleares (0.25).

The Communities with the highest rates of registered *speech therapists*<sup>2</sup> were Region de Murcia (0.41), Cataluña (0.38) and Cantabria (0.29). Conversely, Aragón (0.12), Comunidad de Madrid (0.15) and Extremadura, Illes Baleares and País Vasco (0.17 for all three) had the lowest rates.

*Podiatrists* recorded the highest rates in Extremadura (0.28), Comunidad de Madrid (0.23) and Comunitat Valenciana (0.21). This group recorded the lowest rates in Canarias and the Autonomous City of Ceuta (0.05 in both) and Illes Balears (0.07).

The Autonomous Communities with the highest rates of registered *dental technicians*<sup>3</sup> were Cantabria (0.26 per 1,000 inhabitants), Comunitat Valenciana (0.24) and Aragón (0.22). Meanwhile, those that presented the lowest rates were La Rioja and Castilla-La Mancha (0.09 in both) and Comunidad Foral de Navarra (0.12).

As for *dietitian nutritionists*<sup>4</sup>, Comunidad Foral de Navarra registered the highest rate (0.41), followed by Cataluña (0.18) and Aragón (0.15). In contrast, the lowest rates were registered in the Autonomous City of Ceuta (0.01) and in Asturias, Galicia, Castilla-La Mancha and the Autonomous City of Melilla (0.04 in all of these).

Finally, the highest rates of registered *occupational therapists*<sup>5</sup> were in Extremadura (0.55), Aragón (0.39) and Comunidad Foral de Navarra (0.28). The lowest rates were registered in Madrid (0.02), Comunitat Valenciana (0.06) and Galicia (0.07).

#### Review and updating of data

The data published today are final and are not subject to further revision. All results are available on INEBase.

#### Methodological note

The Registered Health Professionals Statistics is am annual structural statistic that investigates the number and characteristics of health professionals registered in their respective Professional Colleges or Councils. It has been compiled at the National Statistics Institute without interruption since 1952. This research provides information to various international organisations such as the OECD and the Statistical Office of the European Union (Eurostat).

The information currently provided refers to the professions included in Law 44/2003 of 21 November on the Regulation of Health Professions, or which meet the requirements established therein. The groups from which information has been obtained are: doctors, pharmacists, dentists, veterinarians, psychologists with a speciality in health, physicians with a speciality in health, nurses, physiotherapists, podiatrists, opticians-optometrists, dental technicians, chemists with a speciality in health, dietitian-nutritionists, occupational therapists, speech therapists and biologists with a speciality in health.

The questionnaires are completed through a web application (IRIA) by the General Councils and/or Professional Colleges.

Type of operation: annual continuous statistics.

Population scope: professionals in the health care field that are registered in any Spanish

College

**Geographical scope**: the entire national territory. **Reference period:** the data refer to 31 December

**Method of collection:** questionnaire on the internet (web application)
