

**Statistical Use of Municipal Register to 1 January 2006
Definitive data**

**The resident population in Spain reached 44,708,964 persons as of
1 January 2006**

**The number of foreigners stands at 4,144,166, equivalent to 9.3% of
the total number of registered persons**

The total amount of residents in Spain is 44,708,964 persons, as of 1 January 2006, which translates into an increase of 600,434 persons as compared to data from 1 January 2005 (1.36%). This figure is comprised by **40,564,798 Spanish nationals and 4,144,166 foreigners, which represent 9.3% of the total.**

Between 1 January 2005 and 1 January 2006, the number of registered Spaniards increased by 186,878 persons (0.5%), while the number of foreigners increased by 413,556 (11.1%).

These definitive figures (as well as the provisional figures published in July 2006) comprise the results from applying for the first time, the expiration procedure of non community foreigner registrations lacking permanent residence permits which are not renewed every two years, established by virtue of the amendment of article 16 of Law 7/1985 Regulating Local Regime Basis, by Organic Law 14/2003, dated 20 November. For this reason, the outflow of foreigners leaving the country which had not been registered up to this year has been accounted for.

From now on the cancellation process due to expiration will be continuous, and cancellations will therefore be reflected in the annual data.

It is worth noticing that, in this occasion, the differences between provisional and definitive results are the result, fundamentally, of the novelty of the expiration process (applied since 22 December 2005) and fundamentally the amount of initially affected registrations (all registrations existing by December 2003 which had not been renewed before 22 December 2005). All this made necessary to enlarge the renewal period during the execution of the population figure calculation process, which began in March and was concluded by November, in order to **guarantee that definitive figures were as adjusted as possible to reality.**

Data by Autonomous Communities

The autonomous communities which have registered the higher population increases from 1 January 2005 and 1 January 2006 are Cataluña (with a 139,491 person increase), Andalucía (with 125,873), Comunidad Valenciana (with 114,459) and Madrid (with 44,040).

On the other hand, the communities with lower growth rates are Asturias (261), Ceuta (585), Melilla (1,383), Extremadura (2,494), La Rioja (5,293) and Galicia (5,326).

In relative terms, the greatest population increases were registered in Murcia (2.6%), Comunidad Valenciana (2.4%), Melilla (2.1%), Cataluña (2.0%) and Castilla-La Mancha (2.0%). The lower increases were registered in Asturias (0.02%), Galicia (0.2%), Extremadura (0.2%), País Vasco (0.4%) and Castilla y León (0.5%).

These data reflect that **population continues to increase in the Mediterranean coast, as well as in the Madrid and Cataluña autonomous communities.** For their part, interior and northern autonomous communities, in general, lose population weight in the territory as a whole.

Data on foreigners by autonomous communities

The percentage of foreigners in Spain has increased from 8.5% to 9.3% between 1 January 2005 and 1 January 2006. The communities with the greatest concentrations of foreigners are Balears (16.8%), Comunidad Valenciana (13.9%), Murcia (13.8%) and Madrid (13.3%). Cataluña, Canarias and La Rioja also exceed 10%.

On the other hand, the autonomous communities with the lowest percentages of foreigners are Extremadura (2.5%), Galicia (2.7%), Asturias (2.8%), País Vasco (4.0%), Ceuta (4.1%), Cantabria (4.2%) and Castilla y León (4.2%). In the remaining communities, the percentage of foreigners exceeds 5%.

The number of foreigners has increased in all autonomous communities and Ceuta and Melilla. The communities where the greatest increase in the number of foreigners has been

registered in absolute terms are Cataluña (114,853), Comunidad Valenciana (86,090) and Andalucía (68,721). The lowest increases have been registered in Ceuta (41), Melilla (1,091), Extremadura (2,126), Cantabria (3,287) and Asturias (3,461).

In relative terms, the greatest increases in foreign population took place in Melilla (37.7%), País Vasco (17.4%), Andalucía (16.4%), Castilla y León (16.3%), Cantabria (16%) y Castilla La Mancha (15.2%) and the lowest in Ceuta (1.4%), Comunidad de Madrid (2.5%), Canarias (5.0%), Galicia (6.3%) and Illes Balears (7.4%).

Largest nationality groups

The largest group of foreigners is comprised by Moroccans (563,012), followed by Ecuadorians (461,310), Romanian (407,159), United Kingdom (274,722) and Colombians (265,141). It is also worth noting the number of Germans, exceeding 150,000, the 150,252 Argentinians and the 139,802 Bolivians.

Considering the largest nationality groups as of 1 January 2006, the foreign populations which increased the most as compared with the previous year are Romanian (89,793 new registrations), Moroccans (51,718), United Kingdom citizens (47,535), Bolivians (41,855) and Italians (20,414).

The lowest increases in the largest nationalities have been registered among Algerians (801), Venezuelans (2,055), Dominicans (3,937) and Ukrainians (4,226). For their part, it is worth mentioning the decrease registered among Ecuadorians (36,489 less), Colombians (6,098) and Argentinians (2,723).

Regarding relative increases among the largest nationality groups, the largest ones correspond to Bolivians (42.7%), Brazilians (33.9%), Romanians (28.3%) and the Polish

(25.6%). Increases exceeding 20% are registered among Portuguese, Italians and UK Citizens.

Foreign population by municipalities

Among the municipalities exceeding 10,000 inhabitants, **the six which have the largest percentages of foreigners belong to the Alicante province**, just as what happened a year before. In these municipalities (Rojales, Teulada, Calpe, L'Alfàs del Pi, Jávea and Torrevieja) over half of the inhabitants are foreigners.

Generally speaking, Community citizens are the prevailing group in municipalities with the largest percentages of foreigners. For example, in Rojales 56.8% of the population are foreigners of some country of the European Union, while only 12.7% are non Community citizens.

However, in several of the municipalities which have the greatest percentages of foreigners, the percentage of non-community citizens exceeds that of community citizens, such as Torrevieja and Castelló d'Empúries.

Municipalities with the largest percentages of foreigners aged 65 and over

Among municipalities with over 1,000 registered foreigners, those in the Alicante province are also the ones which have the largest percentages of foreign population aged 65 and over. Among the two first ones (Els Poblets and Calpe) over 37% belong to that age group.

Municipalities with the largest percentage of foreign population aged 65 and over are located in the provinces which have the greater number of registered Community citizens.

Municipalities with larger percentages of foreigners aged 16 through 64

The foreign population aged 16 through 64, that is, the population in working age, is the majority in all municipalities which have more than 1,000 registered foreigners and represents 80.2% of the total number of foreigners in Spain.

Among the municipalities with 1,000 or more foreigners, the ones which have a greater share of the population in the 16 to 64 years of age interval are distributed throughout the whole national territory. The highest ranking municipalities belong to the Huelva, Valencia, Lleida and Albacete municipalities, with percentages exceeding 88%.

Municipalities with the largest percentages of foreign population younger than 16 years of age

Out of the 10 municipalities with over 1000 foreigners which have the largest percentage of persons younger than 16 years of age, six belong to Cataluña. Three of these six municipalities belong to Girona.

The greatest percentage is registered in Banyoles (28.8% as compared to a national average of 14.9%).
