Water Surveys 2005

Average household water consumption decreased 2.9% during the year 2005, standing at 166 litres per inhabitant per day

The unit value of water increased 2.1%

During the year 2005 in Spain, 4,873 Hm³ of water were distributed via the public urban supply networks, according to the *Survey on the Supply and Treatment of Water*. Of this quantity, 82.1% (4,002 Hm³) was distributed for consumption by families, companies, municipal consumption, Apparent losses of water (leaks, breaks, breakdowns, measurement errors, frauds, ...) were estimated at 17.9% of the total water distributed via said networks.

Consumption of drinking water by Spanish families rose to 2,673 Hm³, representing 66.8% of total consumption. Average consumption stood at 166 litres per inhabitant per day, 2.9% less than the 171 litres recorded in the year 2004. By Community, Andalucía registered the highest average consumption (195) and Navarra registered the lowest (134).

Release

The unit value of water (quotient between the value of the water supply rates plus the sewage rates/cannons for waste water and the volume of water distributed for consumption) increased 2.1% in the year 2005, reaching 0.98 euros/m³.

The unit value of the water supply reached 0.67 euros/m³, whereas the unit value of the sewage of waste water (sewerage network and water treatment) was 0.31 euros/m³.

By Autonomous Community, the highest values corresponded to Canarias (1.65 euros/ m^3), Illes Balears (1.58) and Region de Murcia (1.52). In contrast, Castilla y León (0.66), Cantabria (0.68), Castilla-La Mancha (0.74) and Asturias (0.74) recorded the lowest unit values.

Water consumption in the agrarian sector decreased 7.3%

According to the *Survey on the Use of Water in the Agrarian Sector,* farm consumption rose to 16,505 Hm³ in 2005, indicating a 7.3% drop as compared with the year 2004. Contributing to this drop was the decrease in the availability of irrigation water as a result of the drought.

By type of crop, herbaceous crops accounted for 46.3% of the total consumption.

By irrigation technique, the sprinkler and trickle techniques accounted for 52.9% of the total expenditure on water.

By **Community**, Andalucía consumed the most water (24.7% of the total). In comparison with the year 2004, consumption increased 3.5% in Navarra and 0.7% in Extremadura. In the remaining Communities, there were decreases, most notably in Madrid (-15.1%), Castilla-La Mancha (-12.1%) and Aragón (-11.5%).
